## Personnel

- Vacancies were posted for Crime Scene Unit Supervisor, Grants Coordinator and Crime Analyst positions. The Grants Coordinator position was filled, creating a vacancy for an Emergency Management Assistant position, which was then posted.
- Positions for 911 Operations Administrative Assistant and Patrol Administrative Assistant were deleted. Employees occupying these positions were transferred to fill vacancies for Traffic Office Administrative Assistant and CID Case Specialist positions.
